The forager Temple, Bude, Cornwall Having cut his fashion teeth at labels including Marni in Paris and Milan, the lure of the

salt-flecked air proved too strong a pull for Conrad Allen, who moved to Bude in 2007 with his wife, Karen. After meeting Keda Hall-Farrise and her partner, Wil Head, who already ran their own food business in the seaside town, they became friends and decided to open Temple together 11/2 years ago. With a passion for food as well as clothes, they dreamt up the idea of a restaurant with a concept store.

Although they stock plenty of international designers, local artisans are celebrated, such as Rose Choules. who produces pretty leather bucket bags (£45) and an attractive teal-andsage key plait (£25).
