FAMILY members gathered to pray yesterday for the survival of a baby delivered by paramedics after his eight-months pregnant mother was fatally stabbed. The child of victim Kelly Mary Favreille (pictured), who died aged 26, was in a

critical condition. Kelly's aunt Rosa Favreille said relatives were 'doing a little blessing' at the hospital where he was being cared for. 'I don't think the baby is going to make it,' she added. 'It's a little boy, I

don't know what they named him. All Kelly wanted was to be a mum - when she found out she was pregnant, I think that really lifted her spirits. 'She was an absolute sweetheart - the most gentle, loving person and being a mum was all she dreamed about.' After two men were arrested on

suspicion of murdering the victim at her house in Thornton Heath, south London, the capital's mayor Sadiq Khan condemned the killing. 'Violence against women is endemic in society and devastating murders in

Two sides of my Mykonos

LAURA MILLAR TAKES A BREAK FROM ISLAND CLUBBING TO RELAX IN A COOL, CONTEMPORARY HAVEN

AS MYKONOS wears its best tan, I've been cooling down for 25 years with my partner. I always make a point of staying where the party is. That usually translates as an inexpensive, basic apartment in the white town, Chora, where a plethora of bars, pubs and clubs keep us happy into the small hours.

This time I'm staying somewhere far less lively but even more beautiful. In the quiet, sheltered back of Agios Ioannis, all sparkling turquoise water, golden sand and the blissful sound of your silence. About 10 minutes from the centre, Agios Ioannis has the distinction of being known as 'the Shirley Valentine beach' and you can still catch the taverna she sat at, now a restaurant called Pigeon Pink.

I plan to head there for a couple of wine later but for now I'm happy just to plunk myself by the water, dip my toes in, sip and repeat. The staying
